DISCUSSION FOCUS

Read (Primary Text): Mark 10:17-31 Supporting Texts: 1 Peter 3:18, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Mark 8:34-37, Matthew 13:44-46, Philippians 2:12

MAIN IDEA:

A life committed to Christ leads to eternal life, and eternal life with Christ is all that really matters in the end.

OBSERVE

Read Mark 10:17-31

What does the rich young ruler ask Jesus to receive? Eternal Life (v. 17).

After the man claims to have kept all the law, what does Jesus tell him he must do? *Sell all he has to give to the poor and then follow Jesus. (v. 21).*

What does Jesus promise to those who give up the world's comforts to follow him? *That they will receive back 100 fold and inherit eternal life.* (v. 29-30).

INTERPRET

What's important about Jesus' statement that no one is good but God alone? *While the rich young ruler claims to have kept all the commandments, the Bible makes clear that no one does. The only way to be a law keeper is to have God's righteousness imputed to us through Christ. (1 Peter 3:18; 2 Corinthians 5:21).*

What does the young ruler's response in verse 21-22 show about where his commitments and love were? *The man loved his wealth more than he loved God. He was only committed to seeking God when it was easy.*

LEADER DISCUSSION GUIDE

How does Jesus show that a life committed to him is the best life, even if it's difficult? *It is the life that is committed to Christ that leads to eternal life. (v. 30). And eternal life is all that will really matter in the end. (Mark 8:34-37; Matthew 13:44-46).*

RESPOND

How does this passage convict you about the ways that you put other things before Christ?

How do verses 29-31 encourage you in the face of the cost of following Jesus?

APPLY

How do we go about becoming more committed to Christ? 1) Recognize that God is in the business of changing our desires - remember verse 27- "with God all things are possible." And 2) recognizing that following Jesus will take hard work on our part. (Phillipians 2:12).
